

Employment Opportunities

Employment Posting Policy - Effective November 2014

The following conditions will apply to all employers wishing to post employment opportunities on SASTT's website:

- All employment advertisements must stipulate the following: A diploma (certificate) in name of discipline. (*Discipline types: Architectural, Biotechnology, Chemical, Civil, CAD/CAM, Engineering Design and Drafting, Computer, Electrical, Electronics, Environmental, Geomatics, Instrumentation, Mechanical, Telecommunications, Water Resources*) from a program recognized by the Saskatchewan Applied Science Technologists and Technicians (SASTT), or equivalent.
- Candidates will have, or will immediately obtain and maintain registration with SASTT.
- Advertisements will be \$100.00 each, payable in advance via VISA or MasterCard.
- All employment advertisements will automatically be removed from the site within 5 days of the closing dates stated unless the employer contacts the SASTT office and requests an extension. Re-posting the position after the 5-day period will result in another posting fee of \$100.00. Positions that do not stipulate a closing date will be posted for 30 days.
- Once posted, SASTT will notify the employer that their ad has been placed on the SASTT website and provide them with a link to the posted ad. It is the responsibility of the employer to check their advertisement and notify SASTT of any required changes.
- Preferred submission of advertisements is in Word or InDesign format. Company logos are to be provided, large format, jpeg or tiff. (Camera ready PDF files will be accepted, but may require editing at the discretion of the Executive Director.)

Out-of-province employers looking to post a position within your province, please email to have the criteria emailed to you.

All employment advertisements are subject to approval by the SASTT Marketing Committee and the SASTT Board of Directors.
